Block Party Checklist #2:

Creating an Invitation

<u>Timeframe</u>: **Midwinter**, or 1 month before the block party *Midwinter is when you will want to choose a block party date*, *if possible*. The sooner this date can be communicated the better. In the real world, this is communicated by word of mouth or email. A paper invitation should reach your neighbors one or two months before the event.

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Invitation Content:

	Date - include the year, which is nice for future reference when you are trying to decide how long you have been having your block parties!
	Raindate - when and how a delay is communicated
	Time
	Location - e.g., listing a house number
	"Block Party" mentioned somewhere
	Your neighborhood name (if there is one)
	What to bring - e.g., food, drinks, plates, lawn chairs, etc.
	What to expect - e.g., grills, condiments, children's games
	Special times - e.g., sing-alongs, children's games, an outdoor movie
	Contact details - how to reach someone who can provide further information as needed
	inting: Print, digital or both? Color or Black&White? Size - printer paper or postcard? Amount Who will print, or how will photocopies be paid for? stribution: Who will deliver the invitation? Who will email the invitation? When will invitations be delivered/emailed?
